Jobs boom on the horizon

A CRAWLEY firm created when management bought it from its parent company is expecting a jobs boom in the next 12 months.

ROCC Computers, formerly part of the giant Redifusion group, is likely to create between 40 and 50 jobs.

And chief executive Mr Mike Aldrich — the man who led the management buy-out — says business is going very well.

Although he could not release sales or profit figures, he said the firm had met all its budget targets for 1985-86.

It's "absolute rubbish," said Mr Aldrich, who lives at Colgate.

"In fact, we are going to increase our workforce in the coming financial year."

The firm now employs about 430 people and Mr Aldrich said he expected to increase that to around 470 people by the end of the year.

"They will be various jobs and recruitment will go on throughout the year."

The firm makes a wide range of computer equipment and specialises in videotex systems which can link homes, offices and factories through computers and television screens.
