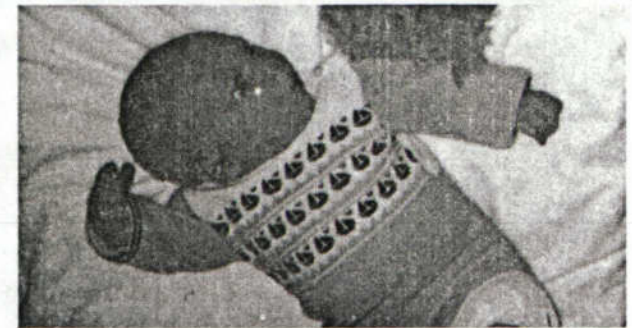

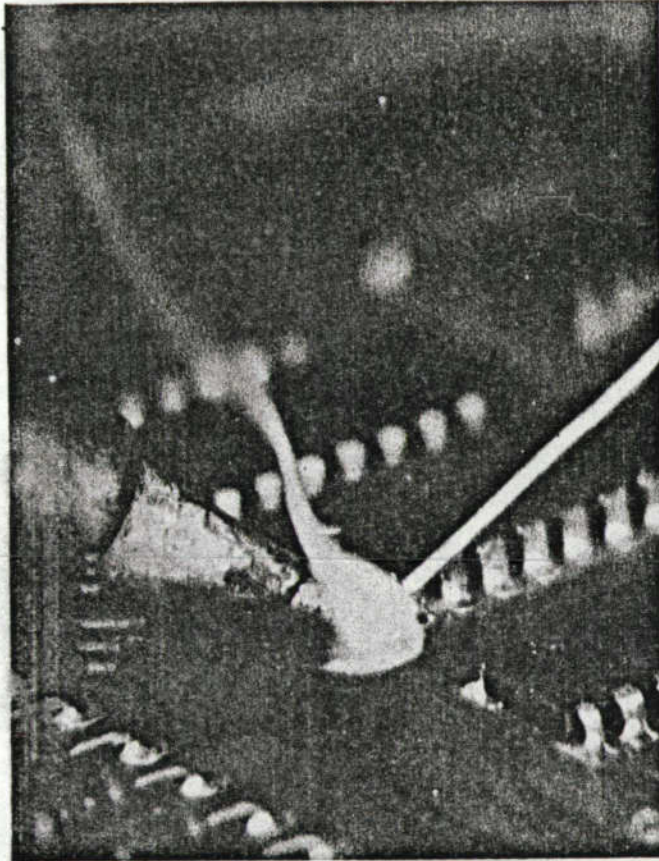

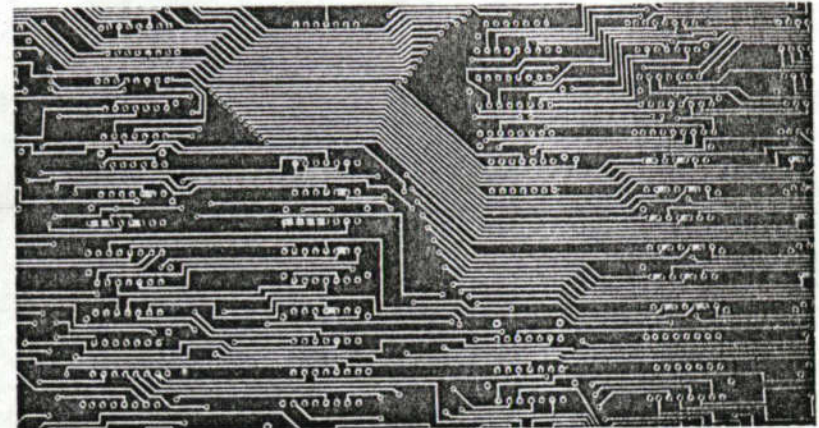
Beauty in the Camera's Eye

Photographic Competition

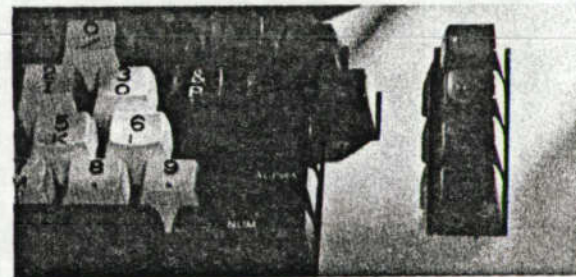
